They are both Colo Vale Association members and are often seen at the Bunnings BBQ's lending a hand.

Lorri arrived in Australia from the Philippines early 1970 and lived in Wollongong, moved to Picton in 1991, then Bargo in 2000. She has two daughters both married and four grand children.

GARDEN TIPS with George

Spring planting has started in earnest after a long cold and dry winter. I am 3 to 4 weeks later than normal planting beans, corn, carrots and the other vegetables that are usually ready to be thinned at this time of the year.

My compost bin did not perform as usual either. The lack of rain slowed the decomposition of the spent vegetables, weeds, food scraps and straw that I fed into it. The worms love the food scraps and stale bread and will attack that source of food quick smart in normal times. I did water the compost bin but could do little to prevent the cold.

There is an alternative however, a thick mulch of spent hay, which is hay that got wet in the paddock and usually is sold off cheaply to farmers and gardeners for mulch, Lucerne hay which is now very expensive, stable straw out of horse

stables, if you can find one that will let you take the stable bedding, hardwood sawdust, if there is a sawmill nearby as it rots down quite slowly which continues to release nutrients over a long period.

Mushroom compost is a very good mulch that breaks down quickly and is available locally at Highlands Sand and Soil, which also has a very good compost available at \$60 a cubic metre if you pick it up yourself. One metre is about two 6x4 trailer loads which can be easily brought home and spread in a day. It is full of all sorts of goodies, like stable bedding, fowl manure, cow manure as well as hardwood sawdust and green waste all well composted, turning some of the green waste into charcoal. If there isn't enough time or space available I recommend the alternatives to keep the soil healthy.

All Natural Wonder Cleaner

Combining white vinegar and the natural solvent found in citrus peels (di-limonene, derived from the word lemon), creates a powerful, safe all-purpose cleaner, with amazing degreaser properties, that smells great too.

Here's the recipe for this wonder cleaner.

Place all your citrus peels into a glass

jar until it's half filled — this might take a week or two, so it is best to keep the jar in the fridge with a lid on.

Once the jar is half full with peels, fill the remainder with white vinegar and sit it in a dark cupboard for 2 weeks.

Once the citrus peels have had time to cure, then using a mesh sleeve strain the liquid into a bottle.

Put it in a spray bottle and store in a cool dry place.
